



Materials Needed

- DK or Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Light purple (ears)
 - Pink (inner ears & cheeks)
 - Light gray (head)
 - White (collar)
 - Navy blue (shirt)
 - Yellow (button)
 - Black (eyes & mouth embroidery)
 - Crochet Hook 3.0 mm–4.0 mm
 - Yarn Needle
 - Scissors
 - Stitch Marker (optional)
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Understanding the Crochet Diagram Symbols

The bunny diagram contains the following stitch symbols:

- ○ – Chain (ch)
- × – Single Crochet (sc)
- T – Half Double Crochet (hdc)
- | – Double Crochet (dc)
- Λ – Increase (2 stitches in same stitch)
- ⇨ / ⇩ – Decrease (sc2tog or hdc2tog)
- • – Slip Stitch (sl st)

Step 1: Crochet the Bunny Head (Gray)

The head is worked in an oval shape exactly like the diagram shows.

Round 1 (Foundation Oval)

1. Ch 10.
2. In the second ch from hook: work **1 sc**.
3. Sc across until last ch (7 sc).
4. In the last ch: **work 3 sc** (this makes the rounded end).
5. Continue on the opposite side of the chain: 7 sc.
6. End of chain: work **2 sc** to complete the oval.
7. Join with sl st.

Round 2

Follow the increases shown:

- Work **sc in each stitch**, increasing **2 sc on both rounded ends**.
- You should see the oval widen smoothly.

Round 3

Increase evenly around the oval:

- As shown in the diagram, alternate between **1 sc, inc, 1 sc, inc** around the curved ends.

Your oval now forms the bunny head.

Round 4

Continue expanding according to the diagram:

- Work a mix of **sc** and **hdc**
- Increases occur only on the top curve
- Lower edge remains mostly sc

Fasten off and weave ends.

Step 2: Embroider the Face

Eyes

Use black yarn:

- Make a **French knot** OR
- Embroider a small dot using satin stitch.

Add purple/white felt circles if desired.

Nose

Use pink yarn:

- Make a tiny triangle using small straight stitches.

Mouth

Use black yarn:

- Embroider the curved smile using 2–3 backstitches.

Cheeks

Use pink yarn:

- Add two small round embroidered patches.
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Step 3: Crochet the Bunny Ears (Purple)

Each ear is made separately following the long vertical stitches on the diagram.

Ear (Make 2)

1. Ch 10.
2. Starting in 2nd ch:
 - Work **1 sc**
 - Next stitches: **hdc and dc** following diagram's shape
3. Increase slightly at top by working:
 - 1 dc, 1 dc, 1 hdc
4. Work down the opposite side of the chain:
 - Repeat the same combination of stitches to mirror the first side.

Fasten off, leaving tail for sewing.

Inner Ear (Pink)

1. Make same shape but smaller:
 - Ch 8
 - Work sc/hdc only

Sew inner ear onto the larger ear.

Sew both ears to the top of the head following the diagram placement.

Step 4: Crochet the Bunny Body and Clothing

Body Base (Blue)

Follow the bottom part of the diagram (blue section):

1. Ch 8.
 2. Work sc along the chain.
 3. Add increases at both ends as shown.
 4. Work 2–3 rounds forming a small rounded base.
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Shirt Collar (White)

Using white yarn:

1. Attach yarn to top of shirt.
 2. Work **sc increases** to form the folded collar shape.
 3. Add small decorative stitches to mimic the diagram.
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Button (Yellow)

Make one French knot.

Attaching the Head to the Body

Sew head onto body with whip stitch, matching the diagram's proportional placement.

Step 5: Crochet the Mesh Granny Square Background

This is the white openwork square behind each bunny.

Foundation

1. Ch 6, join to form a ring.
2. Ch 4 (counts as dc + ch-1).

Round 1

Dc, ch1 around the circle to form 12 mesh spaces.
Join.

Round 2 and Up

Follow a standard mesh granny:

- In each space: **dc, ch1**
- At corners: **dc, ch3, dc**

Continue until reaching the desired square size shown in the picture.

Attach Bunny to Square

Sew the finished bunny motif into the center of the mesh square.

Your Crochet Bunny Motif Square Is Complete!

You can now assemble:

- Scarves

- Blankets
- Table runners
- Pillow panels
- Children's room décor
- Bags, totes, or appliqués
