



## Materials

- Worsted weight cotton yarn in:
    - Golden/yellow (main color)
    - Cream or beige (muzzle and edging)
    - Black (eyes and nose embroidery)
    - Pink (tongue – optional)
  - Crochet hook: 3.5 mm (E/4) or size needed
  - Yarn needle
  - Scissors
  - Stitch markers (recommended)


## Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch – chain
  - sc – single crochet
  - hdc – half double crochet
  - dc – double crochet
  - tr – treble crochet
  - sl st – slip stitch
  - st(s) – stitch(es)
  - inc – increase (2 sts in same stitch)
  - dec – decrease (sc2tog)
- 

## Important Notes

- Follow the chart **counterclockwise**.
  - Beginning chains count as stitches when stated.
  - Use shorter stitches on inner curves and taller stitches on outer curves.
  - The piece is mostly worked in **joined rounds**, with some **back-and-forth shaping** for legs and tail.
  - Keep tension firm so the rug holds its shape.

# Pattern Instructions

## Head Center (Muzzle Area)

With **cream/beige**:

### Round 1:

Ch 4, join with sl st to form ring.

Ch 3 (counts as dc), work 11 dc in ring.

Join.

**Stitch count: 12 dc**

---

### Round 2

Ch 3.

Work **2 dc in each st around**.

Join.

**Stitch count: 24 dc**

---

### Round 3

Ch 3.

*(1 dc in next st, 2 dc in next)* repeat around.

Join.

**Stitch count: 36 dc**

---

### Round 4 – Face Expansion

Switch to **golden yarn**.

Ch 2 (counts as hdc).

Work hdc evenly around, placing **2 hdc in every 3rd stitch** to match the head width in the chart.

Join.

---

## Round 5 – Begin Head Shaping

Work a combination of stitches following the chart:

- top of head → dc
- side curves → hdc
- lower face → sc

Join with sl st.

✓ The head should now look slightly oval.

---

## Neck Section

Continue with golden yarn.

Work:

- hdc across the neck area
- dc across the back of the head
- sc near the jaw curve

Increase slightly at the back of the neck where the chart widens.

Join.

---

## Body Formation

The body is worked outward from the neck.

**Next Rounds:**

- Back/top line → dc and some tr (taller stitches)
- Belly area → hdc
- Inner belly curve → sc and occasional sl st

⚠ Important:

Use **taller stitches on the dog's back** and **shorter stitches on the belly** to create the natural body curve.

Continue expanding until body matches chart width.

---

## Front Legs (Worked as Shaped Extensions)

When reaching the leg positions:

### Leg Setup Row

- Ch the number of stitches indicated for leg width.
- Turn and work back and forth in rows to form the leg.

### Front Leg Rows

Work several rows of:

- sc along inner leg
- hdc in middle
- dc on outer edge

At paw base:

- work multiple increases to round the foot.

Fasten off and return to body.

Repeat for second front leg.

---

## Back Legs

Repeat the same method used for front legs:

- chain out from body
- work back and forth rows
- shape paw with increases
- rejoin to body

Follow the chart closely for spacing.

---

## Tail

Join yarn at tail base.

### Row 1:

Ch foundation for tail length.

Work back along the chain using:

- sc near body
- hdc in middle
- dc and tr toward the fluffy tip

For the fluffy end:

- work multiple dc/tr in same stitches as shown in chart.

Fasten off.

---

## Outer Edge Border

Join **cream/beige** around entire dog.

Work:

- 1 round of sc evenly around
- place 2–3 sc in sharp corners (ears, paws, tail bends)
- keep stitches relaxed

Join and fasten off.

---

## Facial Features

Using black yarn:

- Embroider eyes (or use safety eyes if not for floor use)
- Embroider nose with satin stitches

- Stitch mouth line

Using pink yarn:

- embroider tongue

Secure all ends firmly on WS.

---

## Finishing

- Weave in all ends securely
  - Light steam block if needed
  - Shape paws and tail gently with hands
  - Do not overstretch
- 

### ✨ Beginner Success Tip

If your dog is curling:

- your tension is too tight
- or you need slightly taller stitches on the back

If it ruffles:

- reduce increases slightly
- or use a smaller hook for the next round
