


# COMPLETE CROCHET 8-POINT STAR MOTIF PATTERN & TUTORIAL (US TERMS)


## STEP-BY-STEP PROGRESSION



**START/ROUND 1**  
(Magic Ring + dc circle)



**ROUND 2**  
(Connecting dc's and picots)



**ROUND 3**  
(Finishing point fans)

## QUICK-START: 8-POINT STAR MOTIF

**START/Round 1:** 8-point star motif


**ROUND 2:** Connecting dc's and picots.

**ROUND 2:** Set up, crochet and through, single seam the pound.

**ROUND 2:** Connecting dc's and picots.

**ROUND 3:** Finishing point fans, lonnects dc's and picots.

**ROUND 3:** Finishing point fans to join.



## US CROCHET TERMS & PATTERN KEY

SYMBOL	TERM (US)	ABBREVIATION	DETAILED STITCH DESCRIPTION
	Magic Ring	MR	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over and pull up loop on magic ring.
	Chain	ch	Chain hook or 3 oys on hook.
	Slip Stitch	sl st	Slip stitch inserts 3-ch hook.
	Single Crochet	sc	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over and pull up loop on the through and hook.
	Double Crochet	dc	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over and pull up loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through 2 loops (2 loops remain). Repeat twice more, then yarn over and pull through all 4 remaining loops to join.
	Picot	p, 3-ch picot	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over and pull up loop (3 loops or 4 remaining loops).
	Double Crochet Cluster	dc cl	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over and pull up loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through 2 loops (2 loops remain). Repeat twice more, then yarn over and pull through all 4 remaining loops to join.

## ★ Materials You Will Need

Before starting, gather everything so your process flows smoothly 😊

- Worsted weight yarn (or your preferred yarn)
  - Crochet hook (recommended: 4.0 mm – 5.0 mm / G–H)
  - Scissors
  - Yarn needle for weaving in ends
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## 🧶 Understanding the Pattern (US Terms)

This pattern uses standard US crochet terms:

- MR = Magic Ring
- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- dc cl = double crochet cluster
- p = picot (3 chains joined with slip stitch)

💡 Tip: If you're a beginner, take a moment to practice each stitch before starting.

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## 🟦 Start: Magic Ring and Round 1 (Foundation Circle)

We begin with the center of the star.

### Instructions:

1. Create a **Magic Ring (MR)**
2. Chain 3 (counts as your first dc)
3. Work **15 more double crochets (dc)** into the ring
4. You should have **16 dc total**
5. Pull the ring tight to close the center
6. Join with a **slip stitch (sl st)** to the top of the beginning chain

✓ You now have a neat circular base

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## 🟠 Round 2: Creating the Structure (Connecting dc's and Picots)

This round builds the framework for the 8 points of the star.

### Instructions:

1. Chain 3 (counts as first dc)
2. In the next stitch, make **1 dc**
3. Chain 2
4. Make a **picot (p)**:
  - Chain 3
  - Slip stitch into the first chain
5. Chain 2 again
6. Skip 1 stitch
7. In the next stitch, work **2 dc**

Repeat this pattern around:

➡ (2 dc, ch 2, picot, ch 2, skip 1 stitch)

8. Continue until you complete the round
9. Join with a slip stitch

✓ You should now see small decorative picots forming around the circle

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## 🌟 Round 3: Forming the 8-Point Star (Point Fans)

This is where the star shape appears ✨

### Instructions:

1. Slip stitch into the next chain space
2. Chain 3 (counts as first dc)
3. In the same space, create a **fan (cluster)**:
  - Work **4 dc** into the same space
  - You now have a 5-dc group
4. Chain 2
5. Move to the next chain space
6. Repeat the fan:
  - 5 dc in the same space
  - Chain 2

Repeat this all the way around.

💡 Each fan forms one point of the star.

7. At the end, join with a slip stitch

✓ You should now clearly see the **8-point star shape**

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## 🌟 Final Edge (Optional but Recommended)

To give your star a clean and polished look:

### Instructions:

1. Work **slip stitches (sl st)** evenly around the edge  
OR
2. Add a round of **single crochet (sc)** for a thicker border

✓ This helps define the star points and improves durability

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## 🧶 Finishing Your Project

1. Cut yarn, leaving about 6 inches
  2. Pull through and fasten off
  3. Use a yarn needle to weave in ends securely
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## 💡 Helpful Tips for Beginners

- Keep your tension consistent for a neat result
  - Count your stitches at the end of each round
  - If your star curls, try using a larger hook
  - If it feels too loose, go down a hook size
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## 🎯 What You Can Make With This Star Motif

Once finished, you can use this motif for:

- Coasters ☕
  - Blanket squares 🧶
  - Christmas ornaments 🎄
  - Table decorations
  - Bags or pillow designs
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## 🌈 Final Thoughts

This 8-point crochet star is a beautiful and versatile motif that looks much more complex than it actually is. By following each round step-by-step, even beginners can confidently create a stunning result.

Take your time, enjoy the process, and don't worry if your first attempt isn't perfect—crochet improves with every stitch 🧡
