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Materials & Preparation

To achieve the same structure and durability shown in the diagram, use the following:

Yarn:

- Medium Weight Yarn (Category 4)
- Main Color: Purple (P)
- Secondary: Light Purple (LP)
- Accent: Cream (C)

Tools:

- Crochet Hook: 4.0 mm (adjust if needed for tight stitches)
- Yarn needle
- Stitch markers
- Scissors
- Measuring tape
- Fiberfill stuffing

Optional:

- Safety eyes or black yarn for embroidery
- Fabric stiffener (for extra structure)



Gauge, Size & Key Notes

Gauge:

- 5 SC x 6 rows = 1 inch

Important notes:

- Keep stitches tight, especially for amigurumi parts
- Always mark the first stitch of each round
- Work in continuous rounds unless stated otherwise
- Organizer size can be adjusted by increasing rows in the main strip

Abbreviations:

- MR = Magic Ring
- CH = Chain
- SC = Single Crochet
- INC = Increase (2 SC in same stitch)
- DEC = Decrease (SC 2 together)
- SL ST = Slip Stitch
- DC = Double Crochet

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Main Armrest Strip (Foundation of Organizer)

This is the base panel that sits over your couch arm.

Step 1: Foundation Chain

- CH 10 (this defines width)

Step 2: Row Construction

Row 1:

- SC in 2nd chain from hook and across (10 SC)

Row 2–20:


- CH 1, turn
- SC across (10 SC each row)

Continue extending rows until the strip fits comfortably over your armrest (usually 18–24 inches long).

Step 3: Color Pattern

Follow stripe pattern:

- 4–6 rows Purple
- 4–6 rows Light Purple
- 2–4 rows Cream

Repeat sequence to match the aesthetic shown 

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Pocket Panels (Three Functional Sections)

These pockets are crocheted separately, then attached.

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Left Pocket (Small Storage)

Foundation:

- CH 10

Rows:

- Row 1–11: SC across (10 stitches)

Fasten off and leave tail for sewing

Center Pocket (Phone Slot 1)

Foundation:

- CH 10

Rows:

- Row 1–18: SC across

This taller pocket is designed to securely hold a phone 📱

Right Pocket (Phone Slot 2)

Foundation:

- CH 10

Rows:

- Row 1–16: SC across

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Pocket Construction & Reinforcement

Step 1: Placement

Lay the main strip flat and position pockets:

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- Left pocket on left side
- Center pocket in middle
- Right pocket on right

Leave small spacing between each pocket

Step 2: Attach Pockets

Using SC border join:

- Insert hook through both layers (pocket + base)
- SC evenly along sides and bottom
- Leave top open

Step 3: Phone Support Base (Important Detail)

At the bottom of each pocket:

- Work tighter SC stitches
- Optionally add a second reinforcement row

This prevents stretching and sagging over time

Dragon Head (Amigurumi Construction)

This is the most detailed part of the project.

Round 1:

- MR, 6 SC

Round 2:

- INC in each stitch (12 SC)

Round 3:

- (1 SC, INC) repeat (18 SC)

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Round 4:

- (2 SC, INC) repeat (24 SC)

Round 5:

- (3 SC, INC) repeat (30 SC)

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Round 6–10:

- SC around (maintain shape)

Shaping the Snout

- Begin slight decreases in front area:
 - (3 SC, DEC) repeat

Stuffing

- Begin stuffing firmly
- Shape as you go for rounded head

Closing

- Continue decreasing until closed
- Fasten off



Dragon Neck Assembly

The neck connects head to base and creates a curved posture.

Step 1: Foundation

- CH 10

Step 2: Rows

- Work SC rows back and forth
- Slightly decrease on one side to create curve

Step 3: Attachment

- Sew one end to head
- Attach base of neck to organizer

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Horns (Make 2 – Conical Shape)

Round 1:

- MR, 6 SC

Round 2:

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- SC around

Round 3:

- DEC slightly to taper

Round 4:

- SC

Repeat until small cone forms

- Lightly stuff
- Sew onto top of head

Ears (Make 2)

Round 1:

- MR, 6 SC

Round 2:

- INC around (12 SC)

Round 3:

- (1 SC, INC) repeat

Flatten slightly and fold base

Sew onto sides of head

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Wings (Make 2 – Detailed Construction)

These are worked in rows with shaping.

Step 1: Base Chain

- CH 13

Step 2: Row 1

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- SC across

Step 3: Row 2+

Work combination of:


- CH spaces
- SC
- DC for height

Step 4: Shape

- Use increases at edges
- Create curved wing top
- Form pointed edges using DC clusters

Step 5: Edge Finishing

- SC evenly around
- Add slight picot (optional)

Attach wings to dragon back symmetrically 

Dragon Tail

Round 1:

- MR, 6 SC

Round 2:

- (1 SC, INC) repeat

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Round 3+:

- Continue increasing gradually

Length:

- Crochet until desired tail length

Tip:

- Slightly decrease to taper

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Stuff lightly and attach to back



Cup Holder Rim (Optional Feature)

Round 1:

- MR, 6 SC

Round 2:

- INC (12 SC)

Round 3:

- (1 SC, INC)

Continue expanding until desired diameter

Add final SC round for structure



Final Assembly (Critical Step)

Step 1:

Position dragon on top of organizer

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Step 2:

Secure all parts:

- Head to neck
- Neck to base
- Wings to sides
- Tail to back

Step 3:

Reinforce with extra stitching where needed

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Step 4:

Weave in all ends cleanly

✨ Finishing Details

- Add eyes (safety or embroidered) 👁️
- Adjust stuffing for shape
- Lightly steam block flat areas
- Ensure organizer sits balanced
