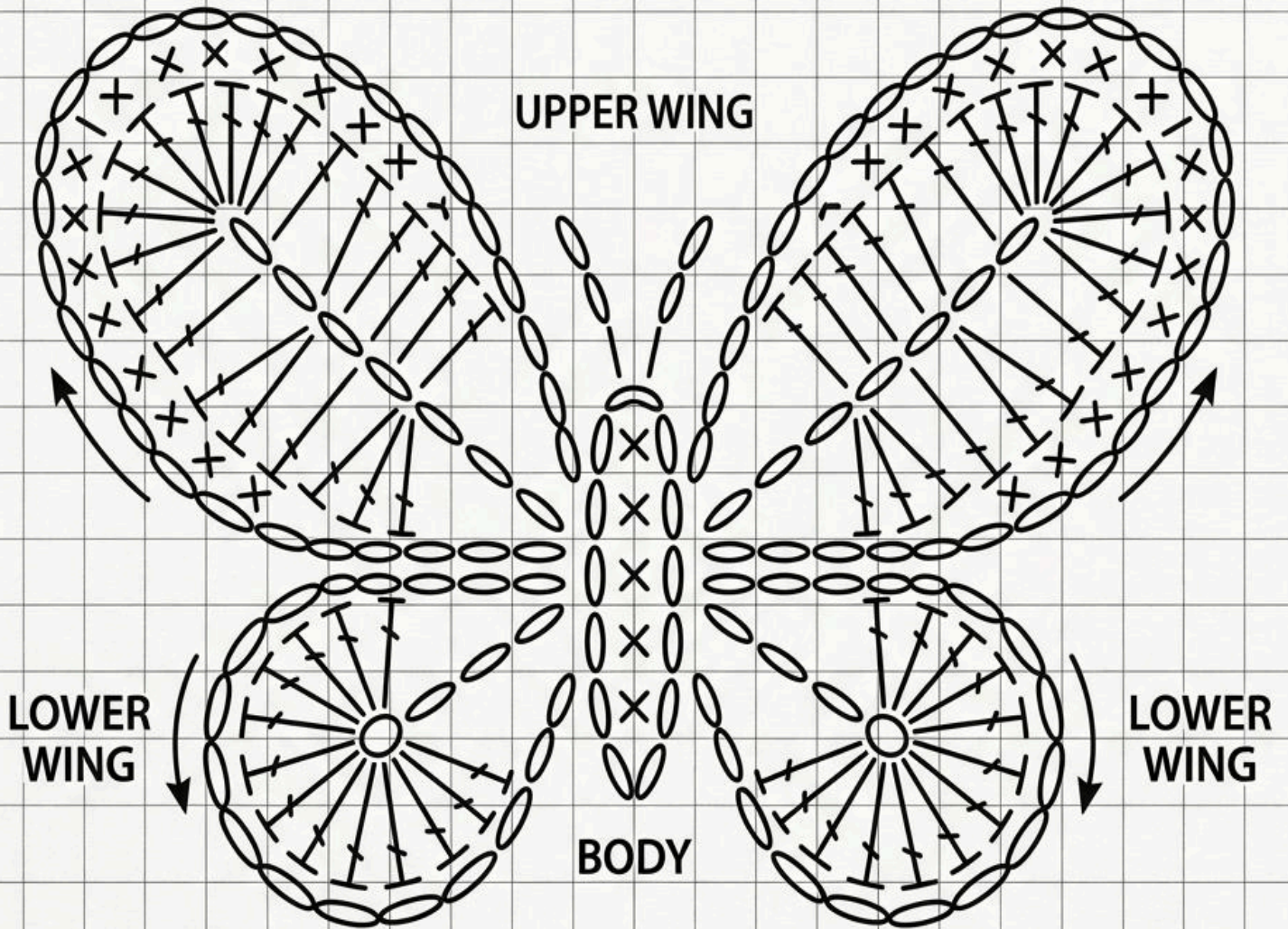


🦋 Butterfly Bracelet Crochet Tutorial



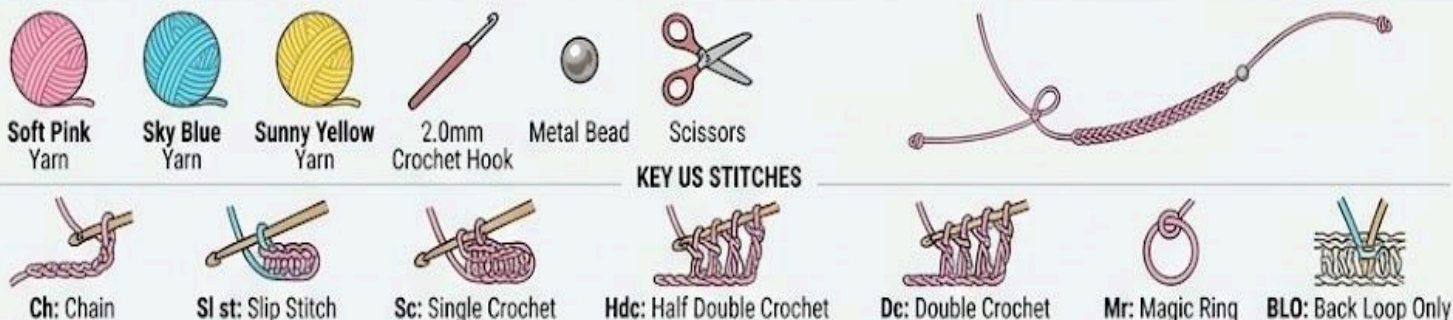
BAND

- CHAIN (ch)
- × SINGLE CROCHET (sc)

BUTTERFLY BRACELET CROCHET TUTORIAL



MATERIALS & KEY US STITCHES LEGEND



SECTION 1: THE BUTTERFLY

STEP 1A: LOWER WINGS (Make 2 - Yellow)



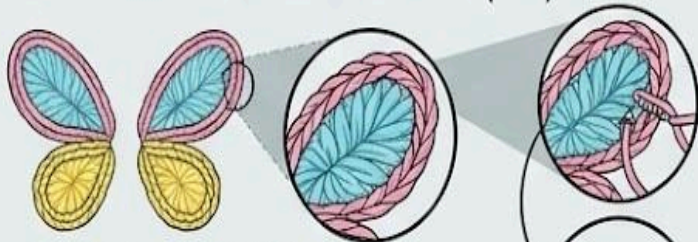
Start with Magic Ring (Mr).
Hdc 5 into Mr.
Do not close completely.

STEP 1B: UPPER WINGS (Make 2 - Blue)

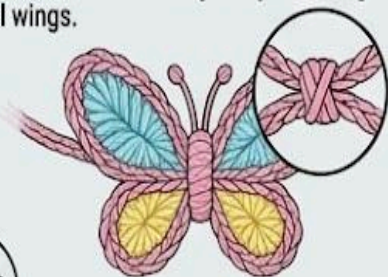


Start with Mr.
Work [1 sc, 2 hdc, 1 dc] into Mr.
Do not close. Repeat for second wing.

STEP 1C: WING BORDER & ASSEMBLY (Pink)



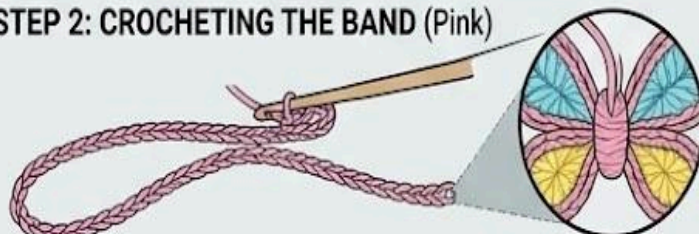
Border all 4 wings in Pink BLO.
For Blue wings: Ch 1, sc BLO 4.
For Yellow wings: Ch 1, sc BLO 5.
Position wings. Fold Blue wings to overlap Yellow.
Slip stitch a tight chain loop (15 chs) around the center join to create the 'body' wrap, securing all wings.



Finished central butterfly.
Ensure wings are secured.

SECTION 2: THE BRACELET BAND

STEP 2: CROCHETING THE BAND (Pink)

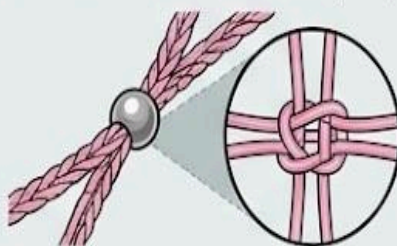


Starting from the bottom of the Butterfly body, chain a base of 30 chs (adjust length). Then work sc BLO in each ch. Attach to the top of the Butterfly body with a sl st and make another identical 30 ch strap. Secure.



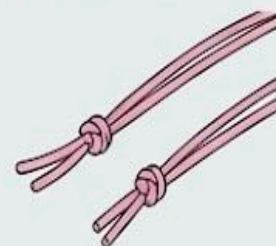
SECTION 3: CLOSURE & FINISHING

STEP 3A: THE BEAD & CORD (Pink)



Feed both strap ends through the metal bead. Make a sliding knot (e.g., square knot) above the bead for adjustability.

STEP 3B: CORD ENDS



Trim excess cord and secure ends with small overhand knots. Final adjustments.

FINAL NOTES

Tension: Keep stitches firm but even.
Color changes: Secure ends.
Adjustable: Slide bead for fit.



Materials & Tools

Make sure you have everything ready before starting:

- Soft Pink yarn (main color and band)
- Sky Blue yarn (upper wings)
- Sunny Yellow yarn (lower wings)
- 2.0 mm crochet hook
- 1 metal bead
- Scissors



Stitch Guide (US Terminology)

Understanding the stitches used in this pattern will make the process much easier:

- **ch (chain):** Yarn over and pull through loop
- **sl st (slip stitch):** Insert hook, yarn over, pull through all loops
- **sc (single crochet):** Insert hook, yarn over, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through both loops
- **hdc (half double crochet):** Yarn over, insert hook, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through all loops
- **dc (double crochet):** Yarn over, insert hook, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops
- **tr (treble crochet):** Yarn over twice, insert hook, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops three times
- **MR (magic ring):** Adjustable starting loop
- **BLO (back loop only):** Work only in the back loop of the stitch
- **puff st:** Yarn over multiple times in same stitch, then pull through



Section 1: Making the Butterfly

● Step 1A: Lower Wings (Make 2 – Yellow)

These form the bottom part of the butterfly.

1. Start with a Magic Ring (MR).
2. Chain 1 to secure.
3. Work **5 hdc into the Magic Ring**.
4. Do NOT fully close the ring yet (this helps shaping later).
5. Fasten off and leave a small tail.

Repeat the same steps to create a second lower wing.

Tip: Keep stitches slightly loose so the wing has a soft, rounded shape.

● Step 1B: Upper Wings (Make 2 – Blue)

These will be slightly larger and more detailed.

1. Start with a Magic Ring.
2. Work the following stitches inside the ring:
 - 1 sc
 - 2 hdc
 - 1 dc
3. Do not close the ring completely.
4. Fasten off, leaving a tail.

Repeat to make the second upper wing.

Tip: The combination of stitches creates a natural wing curve—do not tighten too much.

🎀 Step 1C: Wing Border and Butterfly Assembly (Pink)

This is where the butterfly comes together.

Bordering the Wings

1. Attach pink yarn to any wing.
2. Work in **Back Loop Only (BLO)** around each wing:
 - For **blue wings**: ch 1, then sc evenly around (approx. 4 stitches).
 - For **yellow wings**: ch 1, then sc across all 5 stitches.
3. Continue until all four wings are bordered in pink.

This border gives structure and a clean finish.

Positioning the Wings

1. Lay the two yellow wings at the bottom.
2. Place the blue wings on top, slightly overlapping the yellow wings.
3. Adjust until the butterfly shape looks balanced and symmetrical.

Joining the Wings

1. Insert your hook through the center of all layers.
2. Make a **slip stitch** to secure all pieces together.

Creating the Butterfly Body

1. Chain **15 stitches** using pink yarn.
2. Wrap this chain tightly around the center of the wings.
3. Secure at the back with a slip stitch.

This wrapped chain forms the butterfly body and holds everything firmly in place.

Tip: Wrap snugly but not too tight—you want structure without distorting the wings.

Section 2: Crocheting the Bracelet Band

Step 2: Ribbed Band (Pink)

Now we create the bracelet straps.

1. Attach pink yarn to the **bottom of the butterfly body**.
2. Chain **30 stitches** (or adjust length depending on wrist size).

Row 1:

3. Work **1 sc in each chain across**, using **BLO** to create a ribbed texture.
4. Once you reach the end, attach the strap to the **top of the butterfly body** with a slip stitch.

Creating the Second Strap

5. Reattach yarn to the opposite side of the butterfly.
6. Chain another **30 stitches**.
7. Repeat the same process:
 - sc in each chain (BLO)
 - attach to butterfly

Now your bracelet will have two flexible straps connected to the butterfly.

Tip: Try it on your wrist before fastening off to adjust length if needed.

Section 3: Closure and Finishing

Step 3A: Bead and Sliding Knot Closure

This creates an adjustable bracelet.

1. Take both strap ends.
2. Thread them through the **metal bead**.
3. Pull the bead toward the bracelet to form a loop.
4. Create a **sliding knot** just above the bead:
 - Wrap one cord around the other
 - Tie a loose knot that can slide

This allows the bracelet to tighten and loosen easily.

Step 3B: Finishing the Cord Ends

1. Trim excess yarn evenly.
2. Tie small **overhand knots** at each end.
3. Optional: Add small beads to the ends for decoration.

Final Tips for a Perfect Result

- Keep your tension consistent throughout the project
- Always secure yarn ends tightly to prevent unraveling
- Adjust chain length for children or adults
- Use soft yarn for comfort on the wrist
- Block lightly if needed to shape the butterfly

Finished Bracelet

You now have a beautifully detailed butterfly crochet bracelet with:

- Textured ribbed band
- Structured layered wings
- Adjustable sliding closure
