

Traditional Crochet Flower Cluster Bracelet Tutorial

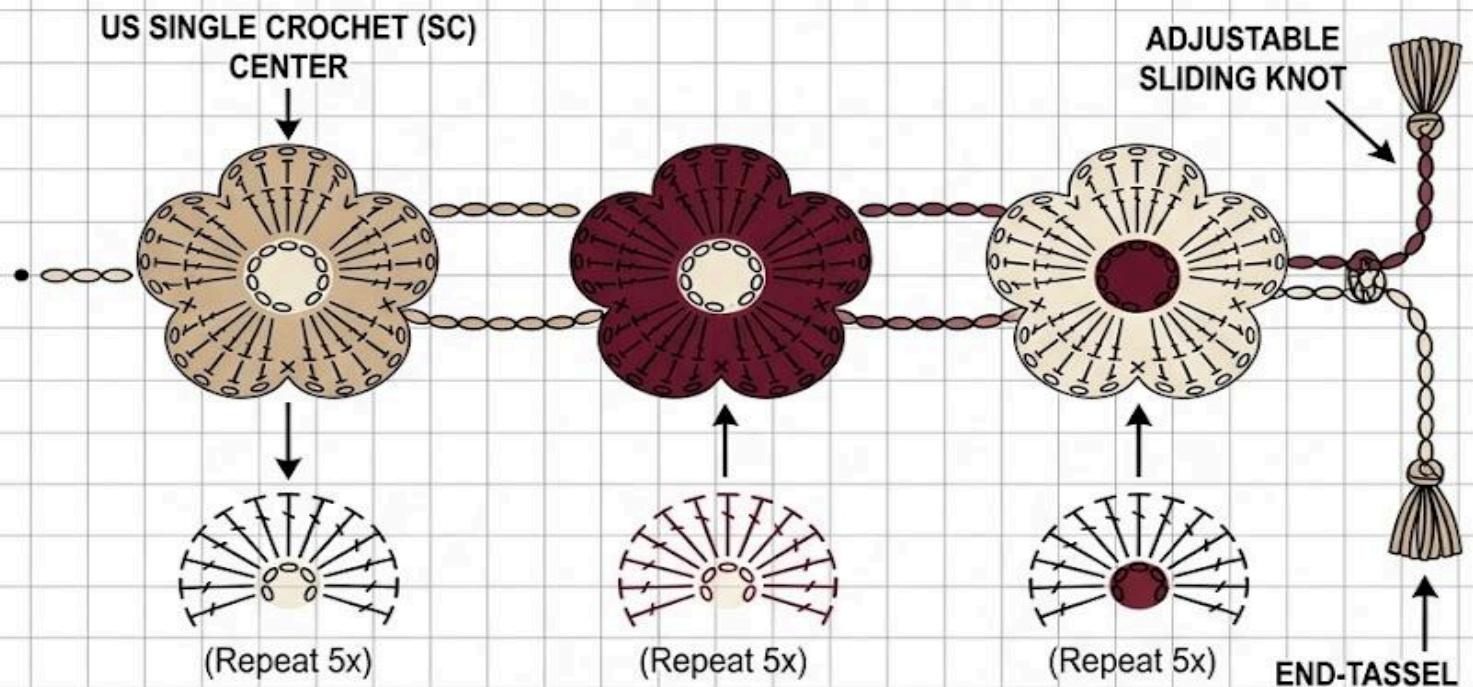
LEGEND OF US CROCHET STITCH SYMBOLS

RECOMMENDED HOOK SIZE: [as appropriate, e.g., 2.25mm]

MATERIAL: [DK or Sport weight thread]

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Create a beautiful handmade flower bracelet using this delicate 5-petal crochet flower design. This tutorial is based directly on the stitch chart provided and is written fully in US crochet terms so beginners and experienced crocheters alike can follow along easily. The bracelet features connected floral motifs, an adjustable sliding knot closure, and decorative tassels for a charming boho finish ✨

Materials You Will Need

- DK or Sport Weight Cotton Thread or Yarn
- Crochet Hook: 2.25 mm recommended
- Scissors
- Yarn Needle
- Stitch Marker (optional)
- Beads (optional for tassels)

Crochet Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- magic ring = adjustable ring

Understanding the Flower Motif

The bracelet is made from small 5-petal crochet flowers connected with chain spaces. Each flower is worked separately and then joined as you crochet the next motif.

The chart shows:

- A circular center
- Five rounded petals
- Chain bridges connecting the flowers
- Adjustable sliding knot ending
- Decorative tassel finish

You will repeat the flower motif 5 times around the circle to form the petals.

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Step 1: Make the Magic Ring

Start by creating a magic ring.

1. Wrap the yarn around your fingers to form a loop.
2. Insert the hook into the loop.
3. Pull up a loop.
4. Chain 1 to secure.

This adjustable ring forms the center of your flower.

Step 2: Crochet the Flower Center

Into the magic ring:

- Work 10 dc into the ring.
- Pull the yarn tail tightly to close the center.
- Join with a sl st into the first dc.

You should now have a small circular center.

Step 3: Form the 5 Petals

Each petal is made in the spaces around the center.

Into the same stitch or space:

- ch 2
- work 3 dc
- ch 2
- sl st into the next stitch

Repeat this petal sequence 5 times around the flower.

At the end, join with a sl st.

You now have a complete 5-petal flower motif.

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Step 4: Create the Connecting Chains

After finishing the first flower:

- ch 10 to 14 depending on wrist size and desired spacing.

This chain bridge connects the flowers together.

Do not cut the yarn.

Step 5: Crochet the Second Flower

At the end of the chain bridge:

1. Create another magic ring.
2. Work 10 dc into the ring.
3. Close the ring tightly.
4. Join with sl st.

Repeat the exact same 5-petal construction from Step 3.

Once complete, you now have two connected flowers.

Step 6: Continue Adding More Flowers

Repeat the same process:

- chain bridge
- new flower center
- 5 petals

Continue until the bracelet reaches your desired wrist length.

Most adult bracelets use:

- 3 to 5 flower motifs

For smaller wrists:

- use fewer chain spaces

For larger wrists:

- add extra chain stitches between flowers

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Step 7: Make the Adjustable Sliding Knot

The diagram shows an adjustable closure that allows the bracelet to fit comfortably.

To create it:

1. Bring both bracelet ends together overlapping slightly.
2. Use a separate piece of yarn.
3. Wrap around both bracelet cords 6–8 times.
4. Crochet or knot tightly around the cords.
5. Pull the yarn ends securely.
6. Weave in the ends carefully.

The bracelet cords should now slide smoothly to tighten or loosen.

Step 8: Add the End Tassels ✨

Cut several strands of yarn about 4–5 inches long.

For each tassel:

1. Fold strands in half.
2. Pull through the bracelet end.
3. Wrap yarn near the top.
4. Tie securely.
5. Trim evenly.

You can also add beads before tying the tassel for extra decoration.

How to Adjust the Bracelet Size

To make the bracelet smaller:

- reduce chain spaces
- use fewer flower motifs

To make it larger:

- increase chain spaces
- add additional flowers

Because the closure is adjustable, the fit is flexible and comfortable.

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Helpful Beginner Tips

- Keep your tension even for neat petals.
- Cotton yarn gives the cleanest flower definition.
- Use stitch markers if you lose track of petals.
- Pull the magic ring tightly to avoid center holes.
- Block the bracelet lightly for a professional finish.

Color Ideas for Your Bracelet

Try different combinations for unique styles:

- White flowers with gold beads
- Pink and cream floral mix
- Rainbow flower sequence
- Neutral boho earth tones
- Red flowers for Valentine's gifts
- Blue and turquoise beach style

Washing and Care Instructions

- Hand wash gently in cool water
- Lay flat to dry
- Avoid stretching while wet
- Store flat to maintain flower shape

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
